NZC Call for Twin Cities

The Call for Twin Cities is now open!



The Call for Twin Cities will select European cities to join the Twinning Learning Programme. The call is open from 3 May 12.00 CET until 30 June 23.59 CET to cities based in EU Member states or Horizon 2020 Associated Countries. Any city can apply, selected as one of the 100+12 Mission Cities or not.

Who can apply?



Eligibility criterion

- Municipality/local authority must be within either an EU Member state or an approved H2020 Associated Country, at the point of the submission deadline
- 2 Climate neutrality commitment

3 Capacity to engage in the twinning learning programme







Future NZC Pilot City calls are open **only for Mission Cities**

Horizon 2020 Associated Countries (Iceland, Norway, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, North Macedonia, Montenegro, Serbia, Turkey, Israe Moldova, Switzerland, Faroe Islands, Ukraine, United Kingdom, Tunisia, Georgia, Armenia.)


Available funding?


- With the aim of gaining and in-depth understanding of their paired pilot activity/es and enabling the completion of the Replication Plan, the Twinning Programme covers travel costs of selected Twin Cities to their paired Pilot Cities [up to EUR 800 per site visit (max 2 visits) covering travel, accommodation and subscience costs].
- This is the only area where NZC foresees budget for Twin Cities



After submitting my application...





Selection procedure



Stage 1 – Eligibility criteria

- Pass/fail requirements related to the conditions of the call
- Proposals must pass all eligibility criteria to proceed to Stage 2

Stage 2 – Quality evaluation

- Assessment (score 0 to 3)
 Applications that reach the highest points for each of the criteria groups
- Interview with shortlisted Twin
 City candidates, if further
 clarification from their
 application is needed

Stage 3 – Strategic selection and pairing

NZC selection committee panel will select up to 53 Twin Cities to be paired with Pilot Cities, based on their mutual thematic interests in the different emissions domain(s), learning needs and exchange of good practices



What do cities commit to?



Pilot and Twin City

Participation in the 20-months learning exchange

(by signing the peer learning agreement).

- Transferability Assessment
- Complete three short surveys for monitoring and evaluation purposes

Twin City

- Replication Assessment and Plan
- A statement of the problem and the likely solutions;
- 2) An assessment of the feasibility of the pilot activity in their local context.
- 3) An action plan for developing or further developing a similar project as in the Pilot City
